Happy New Year!!! We hope you had a healthy and wonderful winter break! We were happy to return to school on Wednesday and continue to strive to ensure a safe and nurturing environment.

As always, please monitor your email, text alerts or visit the [HCPSS Status website](#) in the case of inclement weather.

New CDC Guidance: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) earlier last week [announced a recommendation](#) to shorten quarantine duration to five days. This recommendation was adopted by the Howard County Health Department (HCHD). Therefore, unvaccinated and vaccinated students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 will have to isolate and may not return to school until:

- They have been out at least 5 days from the onset of symptoms or upon receiving a positive test without symptoms, and
- Remain fever-free for 24 hours, and
- Show a consistent improvement of symptoms.

Students and staff who test positive may return to school on day 6. Contact tracing will be led by the health department. Please notify people you believe may be close contacts in an effort to prevent further spread.

Health Checks: Parents/guardians should perform a [health check](#) with their child every day and refrain from sending them to school if they show any symptoms associated with COVID-19 or any other communicable disease. Staff are to follow the same guidance. Please note that student absences due to sickness are considered excused absences. Additionally, parents/guardians should send an email to their child's school notifying them of a positive test during the break when schools reopen on Monday, Jan. 3, 2022. Please email lisa_greco@hcpss.org if your child needs to be absent. Please include the reason for the absence as this information is required.

Masks: [Universal indoor masking](#) remains intact for all HCPSS facilities. Families are encouraged to send their children to school with KN95 masks, which are recommended by the CDC for their effectiveness over the typical cloth masks previously recommended. HCPSS is in the process of procuring KN95 masks for students and staff to have on hand in addition to the masks already available in schools.

Vaccines: The Howard County Health Department and HCPSS encourages vaccines and boosters for all applicable residents ages 5 and older, and there are several [vaccination clinics](#) available for first doses and boosters.

ACCESS for ELLs

Each year, students in ESOL programs take the ACCESS for ELLs language proficiency test. This test measures academic English language proficiency for students learning English in our school and throughout our state. Students will take

language assessments in four domains-listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills.

Maryland Reading Month

January is Maryland Reading Month! Our Theme is Read Across Maryland – MWES ELA Committee is eagerly planning special activities to celebrate reading. More specific details will be shared in January 2022. Please save the date for these special Fridays in January.

January 7th – It's Readable Shirt Day! Students are encouraged to wear a shirt to school with words on them for all to read.

January 14th – Wear Maryland Color's Day! Students are encouraged to wear Maryland colors to school. Maryland colors are red, yellow, white and black.

CogAT Testing

This year, the Howard County Public School System will be administering the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) to all students in grades 3 and 5. The CogAT is a

group-administered abilities test that measures students' reasoning abilities, which they develop through in-school and out-of-school experiences. It is not designed to test a student's academic achievement, but their potential.

The test is made of three batteries – Verbal, Quantitative, and Nonverbal. The CogAT helps educators understand a student's cognitive strengths and weaknesses and assists with adapting instruction to meet the needs and abilities of each student.

All students in Grades 3 and 5 will participate in the testing. No special preparation is required. Send your child to school ready to learn as you do daily. Please make every effort to schedule appointments on a non-testing day.

Grade 5 will be testing on January 11 and 12

Grade 3 will be testing on January 18, 20, and 21

The Gifted and Talented Education Program will use the data from the CogAT as one criterion for placement into fourth grade Gifted/Talented mathematics classes and middle school Gifted/Talented content classes.

Math in Action!

Manor Woods will be celebrating Math in Action in the new year and we are looking for your help. Each month from January through May we will be spotlighting a variety of mathematicians. While it's great to highlight successful mathematicians, we also want to encourage our students to see themselves as mathematicians!

We are asking each student to bring in one 4" x 6" printed photo of your family engaged in an activity involving math. Our goal is to display the photos, along with the featured mathematicians for that month, on a bulletin board outside of each team. (If you have siblings in our school, you can send in the same photo for each student since they will be displayed in different areas of the building.)

While you do not have to send in photos every month, you are welcome to send in additional photos throughout the remainder of the year. Remember, math is embedded in a lot of our daily lives (cooking, building, sewing, designing, shopping, getting gasoline, games, etc.), and we encourage you to be creative in your picture. You may begin sending pictures in now, but the boards will not go up outside of each team until January. Photos should be turned in to your child's homeroom teacher.
