Below is a summary of the attached directions:

- Login into HCPSS Connect (Parent Account) Go to the navigation pane (left side), Select Conference, then Select Parent Scheduled Conferences (upper right-hand corner).
- You should be able to see all of your students in the top, left corner of the screen.
- Conferences will be 15 minutes in length (30 minutes for Special Ed and ELL). Please keep this in mind when selecting a slot for additional children. It is best not to select back-to-back time slots due to the virtual setting.
- Once you have completed your conference registration(s), you can see the schedule by selecting More Options, Conference Scheduling, View My Conference Schedule in the navigation pane (left side).
