## **School Wide Reading Challenge**

The reading challenge began on January 14th and continues to Monday, Feb. 14th, which is currently the 100th Day of School. (We will adjust the date if there are any days off due to the weather). Students will be given a 100 Book Challenge document. Each time they read a book, the student can color in a book on the paper. *Please note:* For students in grades 3-5, 25 pages = 1 book since upper grade level books are more complex. Once the student reaches 100 books (or 2500 pages for intermediate students), they will turn in their paper to the classroom teacher. The student will earn a special "I read 100 books" challenge bookmark to keep and decorate. Then, the student will be entered into a special drawing that will be announced on the 100th Day of School. **Preparing for a Parent-Teacher Conference:** The HCPSS Family Engagement Committee has developed a <u>Parent-Teacher Conference Tip Sheet</u>. Please share with families in preparation for February conferences.

Please join your child's math Teacher for Parent-Teacher Conferences. Online conference registration begins on Friday, January 28th, and will go through Friday, February 4th. No conferences will be scheduled after February 4th. Directions on how to schedule a conference with your student(s) Math teacher are attached. 5th Grade GT Math conferences are available at this time as well (4th grade GT math conferences were held in the Fall and will not be held at this time).

All conferences will be held via Google Meet on February 10th -11th. If you find it necessary to meet face to face with your child's teacher, please email them directly. (HCPSS vaccination protocols must be followed. Any vaccine/testing verifications process in place at that time will apply to in-person conferences.)

#### Below is a summary of the attached directions:

- Login into <u>HCPSS Connect (Parent Account)</u> Go to the **navigation pane** (**left side**), Select Conference, then Select Parent Scheduled Conferences (upper right-hand corner).
- You should be able to see all your students in the top, left corner of the screen.
- Conferences will be 15 minutes in length (30 minutes for ELL only). Please keep this in mind when selecting a slot for additional children. It is best not to select back-to-back time slots due to the virtual setting.

Once you have completed your conference registration(s), you can see the schedule in your parent connect access account by selecting More Options, Conference Scheduling, View My Conference Schedule in the navigation pane (left side).
