HCPSS is partnering with the Howard County Health Department and Maryland Partnership for Prevention to offer <u>free flu vaccines</u> at HCPSS schools October 13-

28. Parents who elect for their child(ren) to receive the flu vaccination must register and provide consent online before Friday, October 8.

When registering, only put in the name of the school and ignore all other searches (type of clinic, age group, zip code, date) You may notice that on the drop down list, you will see the school two times; do not worry about it because both work.

The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. Students will take the MAP assessment for reading and math.
