If you have not done so already, please join your child's Language Arts Teacher for Parent-Teacher Conferences. All conferences will be held via Google Meet on November 22nd - November 24th. If you find it necessary to meet face to face with your child's teacher, please email them directly. Below is a summary of the attached directions:

- Login into <u>HCPSS Connect (Parent Account)</u> Go to the **navigation pane (left** side), Select Conference, then Select Parent Scheduled Conferences (upper right-hand corner).
- You should be able to see all your students in the top, left corner of the screen.
- Conferences will be 15 minutes in length (30 minutes for ELL only). Please keep this in mind when selecting a slot for additional children. It is best not to select back-to-back time slots due to the virtual setting.

Once you have completed your conference registration(s), you can see the schedule in your **parent connect access account** by selecting **More Options, Conference Scheduling, View My Conference Schedule in the navigation pane (left side).**

New Information

American Education Week

The National Education Association was one of the creators and original sponsors of American Education Week.

Distressed that 25 percent of the country's World War I draftees were illiterate and 9 percent were physically unfit, representatives of the NEA and the American Legion met in 1919 to seek ways to generate public support for education.

The conventions of both organizations subsequently adopted resolutions of support for a national effort to raise public awareness of the importance of education. In 1921, the NEA Representative Assembly in Des Moines, Iowa, called for designation of one week each year to spotlight education. In its resolution, the NEA called for: "An educational week ... observed in all communities annually for the purpose of informing the public of the accomplishments and needs of the public schools and to secure the cooperation and support of the public in meeting those needs."

The first observance of American Education Week occurred December 4-10, 1921, with the NEA and American Legion as the cosponsors. A year later, the then U.S. Office of Education joined the effort as a cosponsor, and the PTA followed in 1938.

Other co-sponsors are the U.S. Department of Education and national organizations including the <u>National PTA</u>, the <u>American Legion</u>, the <u>American Legion</u> <u>Auxiliary</u>, the <u>American Association of School Administrators</u>, the <u>National School Boards</u> <u>Association</u>, the <u>American Federation of Teachers</u>, the <u>American School Counselor</u> <u>Association</u>, the <u>Council of Chief State School Officers</u>, the <u>National School Public</u> <u>Relations Association</u>, the <u>National Association of State Boards of</u> <u>Education</u>, the <u>National Association of Elementary School Principals</u>, and the <u>National</u> <u>Association of Secondary School Principals</u>.

American Education Week is always celebrated the week prior to the week of Thanksgiving. *Due to Covid restrictions, we are not hosting American Education Week visits. We hope to resume in-person American Education Week activities next school year.*

Calendar Updates

In order to provide school-based staff with additional time to address their increased workload and to support employee well-being, the Board of Education approved <u>updates</u>

to the current academic year calendar. Three-hour early dismissals now will take place on the following:

- December 15, 2021
- January 19, 2022 (previously a 3-hour early dismissal for high school students only)
- February 16, 2022
- March 16, 2022
- April 27, 2022
- May 18, 2022

Weather Guidelines

Exercise outdoors is healthy and is strongly encouraged. It provides a break from the regular school routine, a chance to get some outside air, and an opportunity to burn off excess energy. If conditions preclude the full recess time, even a five minute break can revitalize children and prepare them for more sitting and academic learning. Children are expected to wear clothing appropriate for forecasted conditions when participating in recess or outside activities.

The decision to go out or stay in for recess is the decision of the Administrator at individual schools. On rare occasions due to extreme weather, a decision may be made at the school system level. The following factors are considered in determining if recess is to be held outside:

- Temperature and humidity
- Wind chill
- Heat index and air quality
- Age of students
- Length of time outdoors
- Adequacy of the children's clothing
- Condition of the playground
- Falling precipitation (more than a sprinkle or mist)
- Thunder and lightning

Generally, it is assumed that students will be outside for recess when the temperature combined with the wind chill is not less than 20 degrees Fahrenheit or the heat index reading is less than 95. Children with certain health conditions may need special accommodations during extremely hot or cold weather. Parents of those children should

provide medical documentation and may be consulted to determine if other arrangements are necessary. During hot weather, teachers should provide students a water break before and after recess. Additionally, any student who shows signs of heat exhaustion or overheating should be allowed a water break during recess.

FROM OUR HEALTH ROOM

Vaccine for Children Ages 5-11

The CDC authorized the Pfizer vaccine for children ages 5-11. Parents should check first if their child's pediatrician is providing the COVID vaccine. If not, an appointment can be made with another vaccine provider (<u>listed on the website</u>) or with the Health Department. Registration for HCHD COVID pediatric vaccination appointments will begin today (November 4, 2021) after 5:00pm with links released on the HCHD website <u>HERE</u>..

Here is some additional information about the COVID pediatric vaccine:

Safety and Efficacy

- Since the start of the pandemic, about 1.9 million children ages 5-11 years have been infected (with COVID-19), about 9% of all U.S. cases. More than 8,300 have been hospitalized and 94 have died, according to federal data. The death toll in the past year puts COVID in the top 10 causes of death for this age group.
- Clinical trials in children ages 5-11 years found the vaccine to be 90.7% effective in preventing symptomatic COVID-19.

Dosage and Side Effects

• The pediatric vaccine is given in two doses administered 21 days (3 weeks) apart. The dosage is one-third of the adolescent and adult dose. Safety data from the trials found the most common reactions were pain at the injection site, fatigue and headache. Reactions were mostly mild or moderate. (There were no serious adverse events related to the vaccine, including myocarditis or anaphylaxis.) Most side effects went away within one to two days.

Availability

- HCHD and 14 providers received the initial shipment of 9,300 doses of vaccine for Howard County. This supply will fully immunize only 4,650 children.
- Parents should check first if their child's pediatrician is providing the COVID vaccine. If not, an appointment can be made with another vaccine provider (<u>listed</u> on the website) or with the Health Department.
- Vaccine demand outweighs current supply, but it is anticipated supply will become more readily available in upcoming weeks.
- HCHD clinics will operate five days a week from 3-7 pm at HCC's Duncan Hall. Registration is required. Visit vaccine.howardcountymd.gov for more information.

HCHD will hold children ONLY clinics beginning on Friday, November 5th by appointment only at Howard Community College's Duncan Hall. Health Officer Dr. Maura Rossman wrote an open letter to the community outlining HCHD's plan for vaccinating our younger children. Her letter can be read <u>HERE</u>

Thank you parents for keeping your children home when they are experiencing various illnesses. If you are unsure, please do not hesitate to contact the health room, either calling 410-313-8326 or email school nurse at <u>laura_ruiz@hcpss.org</u>. If you want to test your child, please don't go to the ER unless their child is having difficulty breathing.
