A Note From Our Administrators

Dear Parents/Guardians.

Last week, you received an email with information about Google Play Parent Opt In for educational apps that will be used in your child's classes during virtual learning. We want to provide some additional information to help clarify the importance of these

instructional apps. There are a variety of apps that teachers can use to enhance their lessons during virtual learning. The HCPSS Google Play Store will provide students with access to a limited number of apps such as BookRoom, which allows students to access and read various digital texts at their personalized reading level. Also included in the Play Store are app versions for web-based applications we currently use such as Jamboard and Google Earth. These app versions provide additional features and tools to enhance the user experience. HCPSS Google Play Store apps connect to a wide variety of curriculum units and are vetted by curricular program staff.

During Instructional Technology lessons, several of our computational thinking units may include the use of coding apps such as Scratch, Scratch Jr. and BlueBot. These apps allow students to engage in hands-on learning involving coding and programming. In some instances, they provide virtual robot environments for students to manipulate and explore. If you choose to opt out, your child will not be able to use these educational apps in that lesson. Instead, your child will engage in an alternate activity that provides them the opportunity to practice coding in a non-interactive environment.

Keep in mind that students will be limited to only these specific apps that are vetted and connected to curriculum units and at this time parents are unable to opt into individual apps.

If you have not done so, please take time to follow the directions here to

Opt In Google Apps directions page to access HCPSS Connect and give consent to opt in, thereby giving your child permission to access these educational apps.

Please know that these apps have been chosen and approved because they follow all data privacy policies. Unfortunately, these educational apps are only available for download through the Google Play Store. We have created a HCPSS Google Play store to provide approved educational apps to enhance our students' virtual learning experience.

Below is a summary of the attached directions:

• Login into <u>HCPSS Connect (Parent Account)</u> Go to the **navigation pane (left side)**, Select Conference, then Select Parent Scheduled Conferences (upper right-hand corner).

- You should be able to see all of your students in the top, left corner of the screen.
- Conferences will be 15 minutes in length (30 minutes for ELL only). Please keep this in mind when selecting a slot for additional children. It is best not to select back-to-back time slots due to the virtual setting.
- Once you have completed your conference registration(s), you can see the schedule by selecting More Options, Conference Scheduling, View My Conference Schedule in the navigation pane (left side).
