

Very Important Reminder

Per the Maryland State Department of Education, masks are required in all Maryland public school buildings for all students, staff and visitors, regardless of vaccination status. The state mandate reflects guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Maryland Department of Health, and is in alignment with an HCPSS masking directive that already was in place.

Masks also are required while on school buses. We have had several children coming off the buses in the mornings without a mask. Please make sure your child is wearing their mask when boarding their bus, and discuss the importance of keeping their mask on. Masks are not required for any students or staff while eating/drinking indoors. Masks are not required outdoors, however they are recommended for unvaccinated individuals.

Maryland Reading Month

January is Maryland Reading Month! Our Theme is Read Across Maryland – MWES ELA Committee is eagerly planning special activities to celebrate reading. More specific details will be shared in January 2022. Please save the date for these special Fridays in January.

January 7th – It's Readable Shirt Day! Students are encouraged to wear a shirt to school with words on them for all to read.

January 14th – Wear Maryland Color's Day! Students are encouraged to wear Maryland colors to school. Maryland colors are red, yellow, white and black.

January 21st –Curl Up & Read - PJ Day! Students are encouraged to wear their PJs to school, bring a book, and a stuffed animal.

CogAT Testing

This year, the Howard County Public School System will be administering the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) to all students in grades 3 and 5. The CogAT is a group-administered abilities test that measures students' reasoning abilities, which they develop through in-school and out-of-school experiences. It is not designed to test a student's academic achievement, but their potential.

The test is made of three batteries – Verbal, Quantitative, and Nonverbal. The CogAT helps educators understand a student's cognitive strengths and weaknesses and assists with adapting instruction to meet the needs and abilities of each student.

All students in Grades 3 and 5 will participate in the testing. No special preparation is required. Send your child to school ready to learn as you do daily. Please make every effort to schedule appointments on a non-testing day.

Grade 5 will be testing on January 11 and 12

Grade 3 will be testing on January 18, 20, and 21

The Gifted and Talented Education Program will use the data from the CogAT as one criterion for placement into fourth grade Gifted/Talented mathematics classes and middle school Gifted/Talented content classes.

Math in Action!

Manor Woods will be celebrating Math in Action in the new year and we are looking for your help. Each month from January through May we will be spotlighting a variety of mathematicians. While it's great to highlight successful mathematicians, we also want to encourage our students to see themselves as mathematicians!

We are asking each student to bring in one 4" x 6" printed photo of your family engaged in an activity involving math. Our goal is to display the photos, along with the featured mathematicians for that month, on a bulletin board outside of each team. (If you have siblings in our school, you can send in the same photo for each student since they will be displayed in different areas of the building.)

While you do not have to send in photos every month, you are welcome to send in additional photos throughout the remainder of the year. Remember, math is embedded in a lot of our daily lives (cooking, building, sewing, designing, shopping, getting gasoline, games, etc.), and we encourage you to be creative in your picture. You may

begin sending pictures in now, but the boards will not go up outside of each team until January. Photos should be turned in to your child's homeroom teacher.

Impact Aid Forms: Please share this information with your families via school enewsletter. Questions may be directed to Kelly Powers. Parents/guardians who work on a federal property in Maryland and/or are a member of a uniformed service can qualify to receive additional federal funding by <u>completing an Impact Aid form</u> by Dec. 31. Impact Aid supplements the HCPSS operating budget to enhance the teaching and learning that takes place in Howard County classrooms.

Outdoor Dining:

This fall many students have elected to eat school meals in the outdoor dining tent that was put in place at each HCPSS elementary school as an additional health safeguard during the pandemic. Now that winter is on our doorstep, and we expect to have much colder temperatures and precipitation, the tents will soon be removed for the winter months, December through February. This is necessary to ensure the safety of our students and staff, because the tents are not designed to sustain heavy snow, wind or ice accumulation; they cannot be safely heated and lowering the sides that are currently left open would not allow adequate outdoor air ventilation to occur.

HCPSS plans to reinstall the tents outside all elementary schools at the beginning of March 2022, with the specific timing dependent on weather conditions.

We will continue to designate outdoor spaces at our school throughout the winter months where students may choose to eat their meals as weather conditions allow. As a reminder, please send your child to school dressed appropriately for weather conditions, especially if they plan to eat lunch outdoors.

Thank you for your support and collaboration in ensuring a safe and healthy learning environment for all students.
