New Information

Fall 2021 MCAP Assessment Home Reports

Students in grades 4 and 5 who participated in the fall 2021 Maryland Comprehensive Assessment Program (MCAP) will be bringing home score reports on Monday, February 14.

The reports show the prior grade level's understanding in math and English language arts. These assessments are just one measure of your child's performance and provide you with insight into your child's level of proficiency. Federal accountability requires that students assess annually in grades 3-8 and once in high school. The assessments delivered in early fall of 2021 were the postponed assessments from the 2020-2021 school year. Reports reflect proficiency in the previous year's grade level or course. These results never stand alone in assessing student growth and will be used in combination with other assessments and class work to gauge overall student performance.

Black History Month Celebrations

February begins a month-long celebration for Black History, which was created to focus attention on the contributions of African Americans to the United States. It honors all Black people from all periods of U.S. history. Among the notable figures often spotlighted during Black History Month are Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., who fought for equal rights for Blacks during the 1950s and '60s; Thurgood Marshall, the first African-American justice appointed to the United States Supreme Court in 1967; Mae Jamison, who became the first female African-American astronaut to travel to space in 1992; and Barak Obama, who was elected the first-ever African-American president of the United States in 2008.

IF YOUR STUDENT IS ALREADY A MANOR WOODS STUDENT, PLEASE DO NOT COMPLETE A REGISTRATION! When registering a new kindergarten student, please exclude current students during the registration.

Kindergarten (Virtual) Registration Week is March 7th-11th, 2022. Details will be provided soon.

Parents/guardians of children who will be five as of September 1, 2022, must enroll their children in kindergarten for the 2022-2023 school year.

Note: Parents/guardians without access to a computer should contact their child's school for assistance in completing the registration form.

Prekindergarten

The HCPSS Pre-K program is a high-quality, half-day prekindergarten program. Students must be four years old by September 1, 2022, to be considered for enrollment in fall 2022. See specifics on Pre-K Program.

Please note: MWES does not have PK.

Gather Documentation Ahead of Time

Having all your documentation prepared in advance of registration will keep the process moving quickly. If you are missing documentation, your registration will be denied.

Student Identification Documentation

- Student's evidence of birth (birth certificate, passport/visa, physician's certificate, baptismal or church certification, hospital certificate, parent/s affidavit or birth registration.)
- Proof of parental relationship, custody, or guardianship. If applicable, bring legal proof of custody (court order).
- Any additional paperwork that may be necessary due to special living arrangements or circumstances.

Academic Documentation

- Student's most recent grade report, transcript, report card from last school attended at time of withdrawal.
- Documentation of Special Education (IEP), 504, Psychological Report, or related services.

Parent Identification Documentation

- Parent picture ID: driver's license, passport, MVA identification or other legal form of photographic identification.
- Signed original, current complete lease or complete deed with your address, valid dates, signatures.
- Current utility bill with name and address (non-cellular telephone, gas and electric, cable bill issued in the last 45 days.)

Health Documentation

- Student's current proof of immunizations signed by physician. <u>Learn more about the</u> immunizations required for enrollment →
- Students who have never attended a Howard County public school have certain health documents to submit with their enrollment paperwork. <u>Learn more about these forms</u> and find additional forms for diabetic students, students with allergies, and student medications. School Wide Reading Challenge

The reading challenge began on January 14th and continues to Monday, Feb. 14th, which is currently the 100th Day of School. (We will adjust the date if there are any days off due to the weather). Students will be given a 100 Book Challenge document. Each time they read a book, the student can color in a book on the paper. *Please note: For students in grades 3-5, 25 pages = 1 book since upper grade level books are more complex.* Once the student reaches 100 books (or 2500 pages for intermediate students), they will turn in their paper to the classroom teacher. The student will earn a special "I read 100 books" challenge bookmark to keep and decorate. Then, the student will be entered into a special drawing that will be announced on the 100th Day of School. The winners of the drawing will get a special afterschool virtual reading with Mrs. Debord and Mrs. Zinn at a time agreed upon by the winner and admin. Happy Reading!
