Dear Manor Woods Families,

This is not an easy time for any of us but I hope that you are able to enjoy some quality time with your family. Yesterday, our staff shared a "flipgrid" via our school messenger and if you haven't had a chance to show it to your MWES student(s), please take a minute to share the videos. #### 2020-2021 Kindergarten and New Family Registration (Not Current Students)

Please make certain you are in the screen for 20-21 if registering for the next school year. Please read this message in its entirety.

<u>Kindergarten enrollment information</u> is now available online. Additionally, <u>Early admission to Pre-</u> <u>K and Early Admission to First Grade</u> opens March 1st. Those webpages will be updated immediately prior to the application open date. The <u>Pre-K application</u> period opens March 16th. **MWES is not a Pre-K location. If your child is already enrolled at MWES, please do not re-enroll!!**

Step 2: Complete registration in person by providing the documents listed below. *The registration process is easier if you bring copies of the documents for us to keep or upload them during online registration.* 

The following documents are needed for registration:

- Child's evidence of birth
- An authorized record of immunizations
- Proof of residency in the form of a signed lease or deed including signature pages
- Current utility bill
- Photo ID of parent/guardian
- Proof of custody (if applicable)

If you have a child currently attending an HCPSS PreK program, there is no need to re-register your student for Kindergarten. Also, if your child is a current HCPSS student at MWES or any other HCPSS school, please DO NOT re-register your student.

If you have a multi-family living arrangement, an appointment with our PPW, Jeanine Smith is required. A representative of the host family and guest family must be present for the appointment. Email <u>Jeanine\_Smith@hcpss.org</u> for more information.

#### **Simulated Congressional Hearings Update**

Due to the unforeseen schedule changes due to COVID-19, the 2020 Simulated Congressional Hearings will be canceled for this year. We look forward to resuming them next year.

#### **Supporting Instruction at Home**

A new <u>resource to help students and parents</u> adjust to continuing learning from home is provided on the <u>HCPSS Continuity of Learning</u> website. Suggestions are provided for establishing a schedule, creating an environment conducive to learning, and transitioning to distance learning. Print copies are available at HCPSS meal sites.

We are continuing in Phase 2 of the Continuity of Learning Plan. To bridge the gap before Phase 3 distance learning begins, a set of resources is posted to the HCPSS Continuity of Learning website. These resources are organized by grade and/or course. Multiple languages are available. These additional materials will not be collected or graded. Phase 3 begins for elementary schools on April 20th.

#### **Expanded Meal Distribution**

HCPSS is providing free <u>Grab-N-Go meals</u> through April 24 to anyone age 18 and under and/or any HCPSS student, regardless of age, at locations countywide. Deep Run Elementary will be added to site locations beginning Thursday, April 2. Meals are available from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m., weekdays. Participants receive a snack, lunch and dinner for that day, as well as a breakfast for the following day, and are encouraged to bring a bag to carry home meals each day. Friday distributions at school locations also will include weekend meals. Parents have the option of collecting meals for their children, who do not need to be present.
