#### A NOTE FROM MRS. DEBORD & MRS. BIALESKI

Dear Manor Woods Families,

Just a reminder and some clarification. Halloween is coming and we will celebrate on Wednesday, October 31st.

Halloween has been part of the Manor Woods culture over the years and continues to be a largely anticipated event by many of our students. This year, we are going to continue with a class party in which children can dress in costume and celebrate with their classmates. As many of you know, we made the decision last year to omit the community parade from our Halloween festivities. There were many factors that went into our decision making and we spent time having conversations with our leadership team and PTA leadership prior to making this decision.

Over the past year, we have worked to create a safer environment within the Howard County Public School System and Manor Woods specifically. We continue to be extremely limited with our parking at Manor Woods and over the past few years, the number of family members that attend the traditional parade has become overwhelming. Part of our decision to omit the community parade is due to our lack of parking, but we cannot overlook the many additional safety issues that a community parade presents. With the addition of over 100 community members on our sprawling campus, we do not feel that we can adequately supervise 640+ students in an outdoor setting under these circumstances. During the school day, it is our responsibility to ensure the safety of our children and we take this role seriously.

On the afternoon of the 31st, children will have the opportunity to dress up for Halloween and take part in classroom games and snacks. They will be given the opportunity to share their costumes with the other students within the building. Unfortunately, this is going to be a MWES student event only. It is our hope that families will have the opportunity to parade around the local neighborhoods and participate with their children as they parade around from house to house for treats on Halloween evening.

The staff at MWES would like to thank you in advance for your continued support with this decision. Again, we would like to stress that our decision was based on the safety of our school campus and the limited parking we have available for you to use.

Although only parents that volunteer will be able to attend our Halloween celebration, we have several other opportunities coming up this year when we encourage you to join us to enrich our community. We would like to encourage you to sign up to assist with the PTA Duck Dash, scheduled for October 26, assist the health room with the flu shots on Monday, chaperone upcoming field trips, and join us during American Education Week to see your child's learning in action in November. In addition, our PTA is seeking several volunteers to lead the planning efforts for this year's Culture Night, to be held on Friday, March 9 at Marriotts Ridge High School.
