A note from Mrs. DeBord and Mrs. Zinn

Dear Manor Woods Families,

Below is a summary of PBIS practices that may be used at home. This was shared by MWES parent, Jennifer Jeffrey-Pearsall. We are very grateful that Mrs. Jeffrey-Pearsall shared this useful information with us as we navigate the un-chartered waters of distance learning.

Respectful, Responsible and Ready at Home:

MWES has a strong history of using PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) to support a predictable, positive and consistent environment for our children. As a result, our children are accustomed to a common way-of-work at school that includes a shared language (Respectful, Responsible and Ready) and predictable routines (a.k.a. schedules and procedures)...as well as the countless other ways the school community supports our kids!

Disruptions like our current school closure are challenging for children, as most children thrive on consistency and, unfortunately, their world has just become topsy-turvy. As parents, one way we can help create a sense of consistency is to bring into our homes some things our children are accustomed

to in school.

Here are some suggestions:

- 1. Provide structure through defining routines and establishing a schedule. Try to establish a week-day schedule that mirrors what our children are familiar with at school. Include learning time and time for physical activity.
- 2. Use the Mighty Ducks language: Respectful, Responsible, and Ready to establish (or reestablish) expectations and rules for your home. It's helpful to do this in the form of a chart, where you list what is expected (e.g., Ready) and identify the behaviors you want to see (e.g., Know what you are working on) during a specific routine/setting (e.g. during learning time).

Google Meet Virtual Orientations

On April 20, we will begin the next phase of our distance learning model with elementary school students and I would like to share important information to help your family prepare. All students will need access to a technology device for approximately two hours each day. If your family is in need of a device and has not completed our <u>Student Technology Survey</u>, please fill it out as soon as possible.

During the week of April 20th, teachers will host family Google Meet Virtual Orientations to connect with families and to help you understand our new learning schedule and learning activities. Our school's orientation schedule is listed below. Each grade level classroom teacher will hold two orientations to try to provide as much flexibility with families as possible. Families should only attend one session. Grade-level teams also are developing an orientation video for families who are not able to attend the live video session.

GT Placement Review Requests

GT Placement Community Message: As a result of the decision of Maryland State Superintendent, Dr. Karen Salmon, that all state schools will remain closed until April 24 in response to the coronavirus COVID-19 pandemic, we have shifted several dates related to GT Placement:

- Families of 3rd grade students who wish to submit a request for a placement review for 4th grade GT Math should email the G/T Resource teacher with this request by April 15. Staff will conduct the review and communicate with families by May 1.
- Students who were absent for CogAT testing in December or have entered HCPSS since that time will have an opportunity to take CogAT for potential GT Placement this summer rather than the previously communicated date of May 2. New dates will be determined as soon as possible and communicated to the school community. Students who missed testing will automatically receive an invitation to testing once the dates are finalized.

INFORMATION FROM PAST NEWSLETTERS

2020-2021 Kindergarten and New Family Registration (Not Current Students)

Please make certain you are in the screen for 20-21 if registering for the next

school year. Please read this message in its entirety.

Please see the updates below regarding the updated process for registration for Pre-K and kindergarten for the 2020-2021 school year. You will also find updated information regarding early admission to kindergarten and first grade.

Kindergarten Registration

Parents/guardians of new incoming students and those entering kindergarten in the 2020-2021 school year (who are not already enrolled) are able to begin the enrollment process online, followed by completion of the registration process when schools reopen.

Once school buildings reopen, parents should be contacted to complete the registration at the child's school. Parents or legal guardians must visit their child's school and provide proof of parental relationship and any other documents not provided during the online registration process.

Early Admission to Kindergarten

Due to state-mandated school closures, early admission appointments scheduled during this time are canceled and will be rescheduled at a later date. Additionally, assessment dates and notification regarding acceptance or denial of application have been postponed until schools reopen, and will be shared at a later date.

Early Admission to First Grade

Parents/guardians applying for early admission to first grade may submit all required documentation electronically to their prospective school. After schools reopen, parents or guardians will be contacted by their prospective school regarding an assessment appointment.

Pre-K Applications (Manor Woods Does Not have a Pre-K Program)

Due to state-mandated school closures, Pre-K application and enrollment for the 2020-2021 school year has been postponed. Once schools reopen, applications may be completed and returned to schools. Please see the link below with the announcement from HCPSS outlining these details for families:

If you have a child currently attending an HCPSS PreK program, there is no need to re-register your student for Kindergarten. Also, if your child is a current HCPSS student at MWES or any other HCPSS school, please DO NOT re-register your student.

Reminders

- Spring Break for school staff begins today, Thursday, April 9. All HCPSS staff will be off for Spring Break on Friday, April 10 and Monday, April 13.
- Meal Distribution: Free Grab-N-Go meals are served weekdays from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m., through April 24 to anyone age 18 and under and/or any HCPSS student at locations countywide. Participants are encouraged to bring bags to carry meals home. Hollifield Station Elementary School will be added to the HCPSS meal distribution sites beginning Tuesday, April 14. Please note that parents/guardians may pick up meals for their children, who do not need to be present.
- HCPSS Connect Outage: The Information Technology Department will perform a routine update to a technology system, Friday, April 11 from 10-11 p.m. During this time, access to Synergy will be unavailable for staff and students, who still will be able to access Canvas. HCPSS Connect will be unavailable for parents/guardians, including Synergy and Canvas. If you experience any system issues after this change, please contact Technology Support at techsupport@hcpss.org.
- Howard County Library Online Classes and Tools for Students: Students can access many learning resources with their A+ student accounts through hcpss.me by selecting HC Library.
