Family File Reminder

Every year HCPSS parents must complete a Family File for each child. We still have 10% of our students who do not have their Family File completed. (72 students to go!) We need 100% completion! HCPSS utilizes Family File for parents/guardians to complete emergency information. Parents/guardians must verify and/or update information for each child, and can do so by logging in to HCPSS Connect and selecting the Family File tab on the left and then clicking on Family File.

Once logged in, you will be asked to update or provide the following information:

- Student Information
- Parent/Guardian Contact
- Emergency Contacts
- Medical Information
- Arrival/Dismissal Procedures
- Photo Approval
- Data Confidentiality
- PTA/PTSA Directory

A Family File must be completed for EACH student EVERY school year!

MAP testing will occur on October 7 and October 14

On Wednesday October 7 and 14, students in grades 2-8 will take the Measured Academic Progress (MAP) assessment. The data from the MAP assessment will help schools and teachers measure where your child is starting the year academically. The HCPSS intends to also give the assessment in winter and spring to measure how your child's learning is progressing throughout the year. The MAP test does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. It is normal for students to only answer about half the questions correctly. The Reading test will be offered on Wednesday, October 7 at 9 am and 1 pm. The Math test will be offered on Wednesday, October 14 at 9am and 1pm. Students may choose to attend either the morning or afternoon session. If your child is unable to attend, makeup testing will be offered during asynchronous learning times. Teachers will share Google Meet information and your student's testing group as we get closer to the Oct 7th date.

Calendars in Canvas

If you are having trouble with the calendar feature in Canvas, please use this link for a quick tutorial. Students need to have their calendars viewable to ensure they receive the codes for classes. Many students do not have all calendars viewable and/or selected. On the right side of the calendar, you will see your courses and your personal calendar. Each personal, course or group Calendar can be hidden by clicking on the color indicator next to the calendar name. Please note that the Canvas calendar can only display 10 calendars at a time.

Emailing Teachers

If you need to contact your child's teacher during the school day, please email them directly. Please be mindful that teachers will not be responding to emails during live, synchronous instruction. If you have a technology question, please call the Manor Woods front office. 410-313-7165

Food Services

Meals will be provided at no cost to any HCPSS student, and all children 18 and under, through December 31, 2020, subject to U.S. Department of Agriculture funding availability.

Manor Woods is a food distribution site. The <u>food services program</u> during the first semester of the 2020-2021 school year will consist of Grab-and-Go breakfasts and

lunches served Monday through Friday from 8–9 a.m. and 10:45 a.m.–12:45 p.m., beginning Tuesday, September 8.

Parents of students who qualify for Free and Reduced-Price Meals (FARMs) must submit a new application every school year. View <u>program details</u> and learn how to apply.

HCPSS participates in the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs which provide families with significant benefits to help save money. Qualification is based on family size and income, and enrollment is confidential. All children in households receiving benefits from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) can get free meals regardless of income, and students from households that meet federal income guidelines are eligible to receive free or reduced-price meals. Those eligible for reduced-price meals pay \$0.10 for breakfast and \$0.20 for lunch. We'd like to encourage you to participate in these programs as needed. The location is close and Mrs. Parker, our cafeteria manager, will answer any questions. Feel free to call the front office with questions. 410-313-7165
